Ridiculous Faith

“Joram son of Ahab became king of Israel in Samaria in the eighteenth year of Jehoshaphat king of Judah, and he reigned twelve years. He did evil in the eyes of the Lord, but not as his father and mother had done. He got rid of the sacred stone of Baal that his father had made. Nevertheless he clung to the sins of Jeroboam son of Nebat, which he had caused Israel to commit; he did not turn away from them. Now Mesha king of Moab raised sheep, and he had to supply the king of Israel with a hundred thousand lambs and with the wool of a hundred thousand rams. But after Ahab died, the king of Moab rebelled against the king of Israel. So at that time King Joram set out from Samaria and mobilized all Israel. He also sent this message to Jehoshaphat king of Judah: ‘The king of Moab has rebelled against me. Will you go with me to fight against Moab? I will go with you,’ he replied. ‘I am as you are my people as your people, my horses as your horses.’ ‘By what route shall we attack?’ he asked. ‘Through the Desert of Edom,’ he answered. So the king of Israel set out with the king of Judah and the king of Edom. After a roundabout march of seven days, the army

had no more water for themselves or for the animals with them. 'What!' exclaimed the king of Israel. 'Has the Lord called us three kings together only to hand us over to Moab?' But Jehoshaphat asked, 'Is there no prophet of the Lord here that we may inquire of the Lord through him?' An officer of the king of Israel answered, 'Elisha son of Shaphat is here. He used to pour water on the hands of Elijah.' Jehoshaphat said, 'The word of the Lord is with him.' So the king of Israel and Jehoshaphat and the king of Edom went down to him.
