

## The Way of Wisdom

Icebreaker: Skiing, snowboarding or Tubing?

Read Together: James 3:13-18 (ESV)

**Consider together:** 

- > Knowledge and Wisdom are different. Knowledge is in the head; Wisdom is in the heart.
- The wisdom of man: The wisdom of man carries out the purposes and plans of the enemy!
  - Earthly/Worldly-
    - Thinks the thoughts that come naturally, and does not consult God.
    - Man's wisdom does not consider the impact of a reality that we cannot see.
  - Unspiritual
    - Does not consider that there are spiritual implications of our actions.
  - Demonic
    - The enemy will make us think we are so smart and then send our thoughts toward evil.
- The fruit of the wisdom of man:
  - Envy Wanting what others have.
  - o Selfish Ambition Are you secretly wanting someone else to fail?
  - Boasting Puffing up self.

## **Discuss:**

- ➤ What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through James 3:13-18?
- What is the result of the wisdom of man? (Consult Verse 16)
- > Do you sometimes or often wish that someone else will fail?

Read Together: 1 Corinthians 14:33 (NKJV), James 1:5 (ESV) Consider Together:

- > The wisdom of God:
  - o Followers of Jesus don't make decisions based on how we feel. We make a decision based on what the word of God says.
  - The Holy Spirit will not lead you to do something that is in contrast to what the word of God says.
  - Decisions made from God's wisdom yield:
    - Pure
    - Peace loving
    - Considerate
    - Submissive
    - Full of mercy

- Full of good fruit
- Impartial
- Sincere

## Discuss:

- ➤ What does God author?
- ➤ Where does Wisdom come from according to James 3:17?
- What are the outcomes when we ask God for Wisdom? (James 3:18)
- ➤ What are you going to do this week to put wisdom into practice?
- Who are some people with whom you can share what God has shown you in this teaching?
